My mother Dr. Ranjana Singh is a gynaecologist and my father Dr. Vijay Pal Singh is a general surgeon. My parents being in a government job, were mostly posted in small towns and cities where I would see them working relentlessly to save the lives of the less fortunate people living in the rural areas of India. They would work hard and would make significant changes to other people's life. That truly inspired me."

For Dr. Abhinav, his career accolades form an extensive and growing list, with several recognitions under his belt, as under:

- The very first award to his credit was for best Clinical Case Presentation in the National Conference of India Association of Conservative Dentistry and Endodontic, held at Cochin, Kerala, in 2009.
- To keep up with the latest in the field of dentistry, Dr. Abhinav completed a program in Implant Dentistry from University of California and a course on Laser Treatment in Dentistry, sponsored by Oral Restorative Academy London, England.





Dr. Abhishek Shukla, Medical Director, AASTHA Centre for Geriatric Medicine, Palliative Care hospital & Hospice, is one such man who is constantly striving to provide the best medical care facilities to such people, so that they can live and enjoy their lives to the fullest, without bothering much about the harsh realities of the world and the times. Born in the year 1975 to Dr. Anil Kumar Shukla, a clinical Epidemiologist, who retired as a Joint Director from Swasthya Bhawan, Uttar Pradesh and Mrs. Manju Shukla, Dr. Abhishek is a man of emotions. "I have always wanted to do something for the elderly people. There are malls for the children and the youth, but there is no place for the older generation, where they can fend for themselves. And since there is no significant commercial benefit involved in it, no one bothers to do anything for them," he laments.

A gold medallist in MD (General Medicine) and a trained professional in geriatric medicine, Dr. Abhishek has also been conferred with various awards for his exemplary contribution to the field of geriatric medicine, ageing and awareness generation. This includes the Vayoshreshtha Samman presented by Hon. President of India in 2016, the President's Appreciation Award by IMA Lucknow, the Health ICON of UP (bestowed upon him by Hon. Governor Shri Ram Naik), Prabodh Kumar Majumdar Memorial Best Medical Practitioner Award by IMA, Lucknow and many others.




# "I AM A PERSON WHO IS VERY CLOSE TO NATURE"

Dr. Abhishek, a trained professional in geriatric medicine from BHU, trained in Critical Care Medicine from SGPGI, Lucknow, is also a recipient of three-year Commonwealth Scholarship to peruse Palliative Medicine from Cardiff University, UK.

With a glistening professional record and a deep urge to benefit the old, he laid the foundation of AASTHA in Mahanagar, Lucknow, which is a 70-bed hospital, providing 24-hr emergency medical support, long term care for bed-ridden patients, care for patients with incurable disease, chemotherapy along with palliative care for cancer patients, evaluation of memory loss, nutrition counselling, physical examinations along with many other facilities including diagnostic facilities, under one roof.

"A hospital is a place where you come with cure oriented goals and you go back home cured, whereas a hospice is a place where you seek comfort, rather than cure, so that you may live your remaining days with dignity and self respect," he explains. With gleeful eyes he adds, "We are North India's only hospice and amongst very few hospices across the country to provide such facility." In 2014, he started AASTHA health resort in Kukrail, which according to him is like a second home for elderly people. Sharing details about it, he says, "AASTHA health resort has been developed as a tranquil sanctuary for senior citizens who are sick or disabled and who wish to live an active life with dignity. Here, we provide all the necessities, gadgets, doctors-on-call, nurses on board and other medical facilities to people who need them."



Acknowledging the contribution of Dr. Shashi Trivedi, retired Director General from Medical & Health Services and Dr. Sandeep Kumar, the Founder Director of AllMS, Bhopal, Dr. Abhishek says, "They have a big role to play in my life. I came in contact with Dr. Shashi during the treatment process of her husband. She was so impressed with the working of the organization that she later decided to donate her entire assets to it, in order to form a charitable trust in the name of her deceased husband, so that the whole society could be benefitted through it. As far as Dr. Sandeep is concerned, I know him since childhood and he was the only man who supported and appreciated my efforts when initially I took a decision to do something in this particular field. He has been a source of inspiration for me, since years."


Sharing future plans with excitement, he says, "I wish to have an organized system of services for the elderly, which should be existent in various parts of the country. There should be standardization in the areas of old age health system, old age hospitals and hospice policies.




In future, I believe there is a need to open up many more centres like AASTHA across the country in order to provide services to such people in a standardized way. One major thing that AASTHA is doing, is to provide home care facilities and we plan to expand these facilities to a larger number of people in need."

Dr. Abhishek's mother Mrs. Manju has been successfully running a computer institute for past many years to impart technical education to the school and college going students. Sharing her past experiences, she says with a smile, "It was Abhishek who coaxed me to learn computers at the age of 35.1 remember he was in grade sixth when he took me to a nearby computer centre and made me join a six-month course. He wanted me to learn the subject and teach him thereafter." With immense pride, father Dr. Anil Kumar further elaborates, "I never forced my son to become a doctor. It was his own decision and I must say that he has made us proud with his success.







His attitude- Think big and start big' has earned him a great deal of name and fame in the past 10-12 years. He has been awarded by the Hon. President of India and his hospital has been declared as the best old age hospital in India. Indeed, it was a gratifying moment for all of us."

A committed professional and a man of integrity, Dr. Abhishek believes in being a toiler. "People say I am a workaholic. According to me, it's the best compliment that I have ever received. People take birth, live their life and leave without ever being recognized. I believe this is my time to do something significant for others so that they can remember me long after I am gone." He then opens up on a more personal note, and says, "I am a person who is very close to nature. In fact, I have a great love for exotic birds and at present, I have a huge collection of them. Besides this, I have an inclination towards vintage cars and I am a proud owner of Fiat Topelino, 1932 model and a vintage Mercedes Benz. There is a Gaushala at AASTHA Health resort where we have eight cows and even horses.









Apart from all this, I am a decent swimmer and can swim in all the four strokes with equal ease."

Happily married to Dr. Amita Shukla, a recognized Gynaecologist in the town, Dr. Abhishek is blessed with two lovely kids; a son and a daughter. "It's a love cum arranged marriage," he shares. "She was junior to me by several years when I first met her. It was during our MBBS days, I remember well. The courtship period was not very long and we tied the knots in 2006." Sharing further, he adds, "Amita is a doctor herself, so she understands that a doctor's time is split between his patients and family. Knowing the level of commitment that is required in this profession, she has supported me throughout the 11 years of our marriage."

"I am basically an entrepreneur by instincts, who loves to evolve new things to create value," says Dr. Amod Kumar Sachan, Founder, Shekhar Hospital, Lucknow. With a vivid sense of duty, an indefatigable love for work and all the inquisitive zeal and inventive energy of a born reformer, Dr. Sachan is a famed name in the city that doesn't need an introduction. Born in 1960 to Shri Radhe Shyam Sachan and Smt. Keshkali Sachan, Dr. Amod is a man of great ardour and perseverance. Besides being the Founder of Shekhar Hospital, and the Ex-Managing Director of the institution, he is at present, serving the King George's Medical College in Lucknow as a senior professor in the pharmacology department. "My grandparents were agriculturists and my father was deputy registrar in cooperative societies. We were four siblings and our resources were limited. In spite of hailing from an ordinary background, I always dreamt of becoming a doctor. The primary purpose behind that was to serve the people, who are in disadvantageous position, just like me," he shares.

An MBBS and MD in the field of pharmacology, Dr. Sachan is happily married to Smt. Richa Mishra since 1996 and is blessed with two lovely kids- Raj Shekhar and Yashori Shekhar. While the former is pursuing his MBBS from Manipal, the latter is, at present, in the eleventh standard. Looking after the entire administration of Shekhar Hospital in the capacity of Director, Richa is an equally charismatic professional, bubbling with energy and dedication.

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Sharing details about the hospital, she says, "It all started with a small OPD clinic in 1985. Subsequently, it grew to Shekhar Nursing Home, and in the year 1995, it finally evolved as a multi-speciality hospital, which was then established as a company by the name of Shekhar Hospital Private Limited."

Later, various new facilities and departments were added to it. At present, the hospital is a 200-bed hospital, with all the specialities, including cardiology, ENT, gastro, gynaecology, immunology, neurology, orthopaedic, ophthalmology and many others. "Basically, all the treatment and technology in our hospital are patient friendly. Our main aim is to provide the best possible treatment to our patients, at affordable costs," shares Richa. Speaking about her engagements and their other establishments, she says, "In 2002, Dr. Sachan joined the medical college and left the administration of the hospital to me. Since then, I have been looking after it. In the later years, a new trust was formed by the name of Hind Charitable Trust, under which we established a medical college by the name of Hind Institute of Medical Sciences in Barabanki.



Initially, it was established as an institute for medical and paramedical studies. In 2009, we started the MBBS courses in it and in 2012, the PG courses were introduced. At present, there are approx 2500 students in the college, and it also serves as a 750-bed hospital, catering to patients from all around."

Apart from this, keeping in view the scarcity of nurses in Shekhar Hospital, the dynamic duo established the Shekhar School of Nursing in 2008, under Shri Balaji Chairitable trust and another medical college in 2013, on Sitapur road, by the name of Hind Institute of Medical Sciences, under the Hind Charitable Trust. At present, the entire administration of these organizations is under Richa's supervision. She is also the Chairperson of Hind Institute of Medical Sciences. "We have also opened up a boutique and fashion designing store by the name of Fab Creations, which is related to the International Institute of Fashion Technology," she shares with exuberance.


Reminiscing about the days when the foundation of the hospital was being laid, Dr. Sachan says, "The days were quite troublesome. Since we already had limited means to sustain, there was no financial support from the family.



In 1985, after the completion of MBBS, I started my own practice to address the financial strains. There were truckloads of problems that I faced, but ultimately it was the blessings of my parents, the cooperation of my family, and the assistance of the financial institutions, that helped me salvage those days."

Considering it all to be the biggest achievement of their lives, Richa says, "Safedabad, Barabanki and Ataria, Sitapur were amongst the most underdeveloped rural areas of those times. There were no hospitals or even job opportunities within the range of 100 kilometres. Subsequently, with the establishment of the hospital and the medical college, we have been able to provide job opportunity to approx 4000 people in these areas. Moreover, the populace now has a good hospital with all the advanced facilities in their vicinity. There is a free ambulance service and immediate attention is provided to the trauma patients. Approximately two dozen doctors reside in the campus of the institute. We have also established a school by the name of Hind International School in the campus of the Hind Institute of Medical Sciences.








The school is aimed at providing free education to the children of the staff. Not only this, the total treatment in both the institutes is free of cost, including food to the poverty stricken patients. We have contributed a lot to the development of these areas and we believe that it is a great accomplishment in itself," shares a satisfied Richa.

With ceaseless professional commitments to fulfil, Dr. Sachan and his wife are amongst the tireless lot. During the time they get for themselves, they enjoy listening to old melodies, especially the songs of Mohd. Rafi and Mukesh. Apart from work, they love to travel and visit new places of interest. Adding to the list of their likes and dislikes, Richa says, "We believe in the power of tenacity. This is one of the positive qualities that we both share, apart from the other facets of life. We face the challenges by mutual discussions and by learning from the experiences of others. Lage Raho is the mantra that we strongly believe in."










Further, sharing the plans about the organizations, she speaks with exhilaration. "We are yet to introduce the post graduation courses in the colleges. Apart from this, we wish to establish a law college in UP and also a good cancer treatment centre in the state," Richa shares. The institutes are sufficient to support my family and in future, I wish to lead the path of spiritual development," muses the learned professor.



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

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

His efforts were highly appreciated and recognized all over. "As a matter of fact, I have done a lot of research in multiple diseases where the chances of cure were pretty negligible," he quips. Equipped with a rich clinical and research experience, Dr Girish has presented several research papers and delivered lectures in International Homeopathic Conferences held in France, England, Italy, Pakistan, USA, Japan, Malaysia, Singapore, Thailand, Brazil, Sri Lanka, Bangladesh, Australia and others. He has done Ph.D in Homeopathy, which very few homeopaths in the country have done. Not only this, he has also established Homeopathic Research Foundation, which has received research projects on Prostate, Ovarian Cysts and PCOD etc. from the Ministry of Ayush, Government of India. Needless to say, he has carved a special place for himself, not only in the field of homeopathy but also in the hearts of his patients who come to him from far and wide.

His clinic, popularly known as Gaurang Clinic & Centre for Homeopathic Research, is one of its kind in the city. "We have a team of seven doctors including me and my son-Dr. Gaurang, with a total staff of 24 to look after the patients. My wife is the Managing Director and the entire management is looked after by my daughter-in-law Shivani.



The clinic is well-equipped with a physiotherapy unit, a mycology lab and even a pathology lab for the best treatment. There is also a psychologist in the clinic for counselling purposes and a yoga consultant that helps the patients heal better," he shares.

Deliberating further, he says, "We generally deal in speciality and super speciality cases. The most common ones being the gynaecological issues, kidney problems, gallstones, liver cirrhosis, prostateproblems, all types of arthritis, skin diseases and many others. Unlike others, we maintain a full record of our patients including their suggestive medications and their response to it. Here, we treat the patients with a holistic approach because we strongly believe that no two individuals are the same."

Dr. Gupta tied the nuptial knot with Seema in the year 1982. The couple is blessed with two children-Gaurang and Sawani. While the former is MD Homeopathy in Psychiatry, the latter is pursuing her M.Sc. in clinical psychology from Mangalore. 








Bustling throughout the day with unmatched devotion, Dr. Girish is a man of words. He has successfully treated umpteen surgical diseases like fibroids, thyroid tumour, breasts tumour, ovarian cysts, gallstones, kidney stones etc. merely by medications and even published the cases for the world to see. This is the reason, patients invest their time and faith in him, placing him on a high pedestal. Committed to bring homeopathy in the mainstream of science, he has four different aims: Treatment, Training, Publication and Research. "I have kept my love for research alive during all these years. There is still a lot of research required in homeopathy and we'll continue to work in that direction. I think, what all I am doing is sufficient. Yes, there is a book on dermatological issues that is currently in the pipeline. It is based on the research work that we have done so far on Leucoderma, Psoriasis, Lichen Planus, Warts, Molluscum and fungal infections of skin, hair & nail, which are all difficult to cure," shares Dr. Gupta on a parting note.

That was the time when I developed different research projects based on these cases of mine, analysed the data further and published them in various journals. Later, I compiled all of them and presented it in the form of a book."

Talking about his extensive research during the last 35 years, he says, "I started my practice in 1982 with a two room set. We couldn't afford a compounder then and my wife used to dispense the medicines for me. Immediately after passing my exams, I got inclined towards research and was strongly determined to prove that homeopathy isn't merely a placebo. I was actively involved in research work from 1982-1985 at CDRI, Lucknow. Initially, I tested the effect of homeopathy on plants. While the others were sceptical about my experiment, I was sure about the results. This was the first experiment that I conducted on Tobacco mosaic virus and much to my content, it was not only successful but also gained enormous popularity and caused a flutter in the entire homeopathic community."

In the years that followed, he even conducted research on animal viruses including the chicken embryo virus. He published this paper in the British Homeopathic Journal, based on which he was invited to present his findings in an international conference in France in 1985.

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

Sister Tekla first inspired me to pursue a course in medicine while I was still in school. In fact, she was instrumental in cultivating me as a good human being and I can't thank her enough for that," shares Dr. Gita further.

After earning a scholarship in the MBBS entrance examination, Dr. Gita joined the King George's Medical College, Lucknow, in 1978. It was at the KGMC itself that she met her future husband, Dr. Anil Khanna. The duo got married after completing their MBBS course and continued with their MS. The first proper job for Dr. Gita after completing her MS, was with Fatima Hospital. "Initially, after completing our MS, we both joined a hospital near Unnao but the atmosphere there was not professional at all. After working there for some time, we both switched. I believe that was a period when I realized that no matter how much we study or learn as professionals, what's actually important is how effective we are as doctors in helping our patients. The real value lies in utilizing our knowledge for our patients," says Dr. Anil Khanna.



It was like setting up a garden. The doctor-duo founded Ajanta Hospital & IVF Center in 1997. Within a year, they gave to Uttar Pradesh its first test-tube baby- Prarthna, given birth by a menopausal mother, in 1998. The Ajanta Hospital has accomplished a consistent IVF success rate of more than 55% with carry-home baby rate of 30-40%. Today, they are one of the most sought-after IVF facilities in India. Dr. Anil Khanna, Surgeon and Laparoscopic Surgery Specialist, who is also Co-founder Director of the 150-bedded multi-specialty centre, believes that doctors need to establish a personal and emotional bond with their patients and learn to empathize with them. "Our hospital mission statement is therefore- 'Always Grow, Always Learn'. 


#### State-of-art facilities at the hospital



Infertility may be a lifestyle issue, but, adds Dr. Gita, "Infertility can be attributed to both the female and the male partner. The increase in infertility cases is primarily because of the rising trend of late marriages and unhealthy lifestyle. It is also because more couples are now aware and are voluntarily coming to the clinic for treatment. We always encourage couples to come and sit together as a unit and not individually." As Ajanta Hospital & IVF Center marches ahead on the path of success, Dr. Anil Khanna suggests patients to promptly seek medical aid in case a couple fails to carry a pregnancy successfully, even after one year of continued cohabitation. "I believe that such couples must ensure timely medical checkup to zero in on the exact cause. Also while doing so, they must enquire about how experienced the doctors are, success rate of the clinic, quality of drugs used, lab quality and rating," advises Dr. Anil Khanna.

Sharing the story of her own marriage, Dr. Gita smiles and says, "My husband and I were batch mates at KGMC, but I started paying attention to him only in my second year at the college. Till then, it was all about competition amongst us, as we both used to be toppers.


### DR. RAM MANOHAR LOHIA INSTITUTE OF MEDICAL SCIENCES

In order to be successful, one should be persistent, and sometimes even be punishing to himself," says one of the most eminent doctors of Lucknow, Dr. Kailash Narayan Singh, who is the owner of Mayo Hospital, Lucknow. A courteous personality, adorned with a compassionate attitude is what describes him the best. Born to Late Shri Rudra Pratap Singh and Late Smt. Rumali Devi in the year 1955, Dr. Kailash is well-known in the city for his amiable temperament, always ready with a kind word and a smile. "Hard work, dedication and perseverance are the mantras that I strongly believe in. I do get inspired by people who go that extra mile to fulfil their dreams," he muses.

Dr. Kailash has completed his MBBS and then MD (Medicine) from abroad. Prior to the establishment of the Mayo Hospital in 2000, he has served the SBA Corporation, USA, as a consultant physician, for three years. He was married to Smt. Madhulika Singh in the year 1982. Recalling the story behind the establishment of the hospital, Madhulika says, "My father-in-law was research director in Scott Paper, US, and later, the vice-president of DuPont. We were well-settled there but my mother-in-law wished to have a base in India as well. In the year 1995, she expired and in 1997 we came to India. Thereafter we bought the land and the groundwork of the hospital commenced in December 1999. When the foundation of Mayo was laid, there was no private hospital in the city having the facilities of ventilator, dialysis or even ICU. No trauma patients were accepted in the hospitals during those times.

### KING GEORGE'S MEDICAL UNIVERSITY

**UTTAR PRADESH** 

King George's Medical University is one of the oldest medical institutions of the country. The original idea of starting a medical college in Lucknow was of the Maharaja of Vijanagaram in 1870. Finally, it was completed and the work of the first medical session was started in October 1911, though the ceremonial opening of the college building by Sir John Prescot Hewett happened in January 27, 1912.

With its 1250 undergraduate students (including 280 dental students) and 450 postgraduate students at any given time, the university has a vibrant campus life. The campus is spread over an area of roughly 100,000 sq metres. It is situated about 5 km from Charbagh railway station and is well connected to all parts of the city by public transport systems such as bus, tempo and taxi. The university has seminal departments like, medicine, surgery, pediatrics, obstetrics & gynaecology, cardiology, neurology, psychiatry, neurosurgery, plastic surgery, rheumatology, geriatric mental health, surgical oncology, chest medicine, pathology, pharmacology, anesthesiology, ophthalmology, urology and community medicine, etc.





Also, the hospital faculty was not allowed to join any other hospital. This was the reason the doctors' availability in our hospital has always been good. We provided for an ambulance, a ward boy, a driver and a security guard to assist the doctors during winters. Even today, we provide a vehicle along with two security guards to escort the female staff."

At present, Dr. Kailash and Madhulika, along with their son Rahul and daughter-in-law Snigdha, collectively work as a team to give a hefty shove to Mayo and to fulfil all the emerging needs of the doctors and the patients. Together, they toil hard—in order to perpetuate the level of excellence that they had demonstrated so far. Sharing details about the hospital and the Mayo Institute, Dr. Kailash says, "We have three establishments. One is the Mayo Hospital in Gomti Nagar, Lucknow. It's a 200-bed hospital with all the modern medical facilities under one roof. It is the first hospital in the city to provide a well-equipped trauma centre, along with ICU, CCU, NICU, PICU, dialysis and all the other facilities. As a matter of fact, you can rarely find the personalized services that we provide, in any other hospital.



Every morning a person from the admin department visits the patients to listen and cater to their needs and grievances. Apart from this hospital, we have also opened up a 100-bed hospital by the same name in Jalalpur. It is running entirely on the principle of no profit no loss. We have provided all the facilities there at subsidized rates. The doctors from the Lucknow hospital visit this hospital once a week and we even provide a free ambulance service to call upon any patient who is found in a critical state."

There's also a Mayo Institute of Medical Sciences in Barabanki which is a 1500-bed, well-equipped multi-speciality hospital catering to the requirements of the populace around Lucknow. The Mayo School of Nursing provides rich opportunities for students to pursue collaborative and interdisciplinary education and independent study projects in the field of nursing education.



#### SANJAY GANDHI POSTGRADUATE INSTITUTE OF MEDICAL SCIENCES

LUCKNOW

The premier institute was established under the State Legislature Act, Uttar Pradesh, in 1983, and is named after Sanjay Gandhi, brother of late PM Rajiv Gandhi. The institute has a 550 acres residential campus on the Raebareli Road, 15 kms from the main city. The institute offers its own degrees, which are recognised by the Medical Council of India. SGPGIMS delivers tertiary medical care, super-specialty teaching, training and research. It offers DM, MCh, MD, Ph.D, postdoctoral fellowships (PDF) and postdoctoral certificate courses (PDCC) and senior residency.

The institute has more than 190 faculty members in 29 academic departments. The academic departments are engaged in teaching, training, patient care and research. The institute has a hospital-wide computer network with more than 500 computers spread all over the hospital and departments.

The happy-go-lucky couple Dr. Kailash and his wife are an inspirational source for many. They not only have struggled 24\*7 to provide the best medical services in the city but have also proved themselves by establishing the Mayo Empire in a very short duration. "Mayo is like a family for us. We have always treated the doctors in a homely manner. Needless to say, a lot of credit for our success goes to our team as well. They have supported us through the entire thicks and thins," says Dr. Kailash.

Dr. Kailash shares about his marriage- "It was the case of love at first sight. My father and her father were roommates in BHU for six months. That way her family was already well-connected to mine. I knew her father and her brother, but surprisingly I hadn't met her before."



However, we included all these facilities in our hospital. There were five operation theatres and we had two doctors initially in each department," she shares.

Dr. Kailash also chips in with enthusiasm, about their inspiring journey. "We were the first one to introduce NICU in the city. Not only this, we had a team of three efficient doctors who were dedicated and well-trained to take care of the trauma patients. We have even treated patients with no identities, in our trauma centre. Our motto has always been to save lives first. During this entire process we received a lot of cooperation from the police department," he shares. Today, they are pioneers in the field of trauma, providing the fastest services to the emergency patients in the region.



# **JOURNEY TO THE ZENITH**



"My childhood was a relaxed one, spent in the company of friends in a government colony setup. Evenings were meant for playground and sometimes, in the colony club where we used to play table tennis and carom. I believe that community upbringing helped me develop a sense of empathy with others, something that I treasure today. Hence I consider myself lucky to have that kind of upbringing," shares Dr. Srivastava.






He pursued his calling and soon entered the portals of the prestigious KGMU. The seriousness of the medical course never intimidated Sandeep and he mixed his academic excellence with dollops of Shenanigans. 

The only major transition I saw in my formative days was from a boys' school to a more open college campus. I remember a particular incident from those days when frolicking with friends on a picnic, somebody mixed some laxative in food we had sourced from the hostel canteen.

Starting his practice with Medical Care Center, a general hospital in Alambagh in 1998, it took another few years and a lot of grind to finally establish Sun Eye hospital in 2005. "I had around Rs 30,000 in my pocket when I finished my MS degree. My father lent me another Rs 30,000 to buy a slit lamp to start practice. I was fortunate enough to secure a rent free 8x9 feet chamber in Medical Care Center where I only had to pay a part of my fees. I remember seeing 18 patients during first month of my practice and ended up earning Rs 450 as my fee. Two years later, when the need of a better microscope to conduct surgeries was felt, I realized that we had nothing to put as collateral to secure a loan from the bank. We somehow managed to arrange the finance by god's grace. Similar situation arose when we wanted to buy Phaco machine for cataract surgery. We had to mortgage our house to secure loan for same," reveals Dr. Srivastava.

The exponential growth of Sun Eye Hospital has made doctors around the country curious who often pay a visit to the facility. "Over last 10 years, we have performed over 50,000 surgeries, none of which developed any post-operative complication.



However, I would attribute the success of this hospital to the relationship we have cultivated with our doctors and support staff. A hospital can only be as good as the staff manning it. We believe that if a doctor gets a good environment to treat his patients, that positivity automatically gets transferred to the patient," says Dr. Nandita Sudhir, who looks after the administration of hospital.

Adding to it, Dr. Srivastava feels that one must not hesitate in imbibing best practices from other hospitals. "I never hesitate in learning about new things, even from my juniors. Putting these learnings into practice a different ballgame altogether. I believe one should not delay over implementation of such things and they should be put in place immediately. This in turn helps us to focus on our patients and make them feel welcome and well attended to. I think that is the most important part of running a hospital. Infrastructure and machines come second. We make it a point to regularly ask our patients for their feedback to further improve our facilities because their satisfaction is of paramount importance to us," shares Dr. Srivastava.


