



Shri Puran Chandra Gupta

A freedom fighter with a revolutionary zeal, a journalist with entrepreneurial skills and above all a loving family man - that perhaps sums up the personality of Puran Chandra Gupta, a visionary who gave a new direction to Hindi journalism with the establishment of the Jagran newspaper group.

Born on January 2, 1912, in Kalpi village of Bundelkhand, Puran Chandra Gupta lost his father at a tender age. But his mother's love and protection never made him feel the loss and he grew up to be a strong and practical individual. During his childhood, he was witness to the tyrannical rule of the British, which left a deep impact on him. So, as a young man he joined the freedom struggle. He strongly believed in the words of Mahatma Gandhi that only Hindi as a national language could bind the entire nation together.

So, along with his friends, Puran Chandra Gupta formed a group, Shri Hindi Vidyarthi Sampradaa and later established a Hindi Bhavan in Kalpi. His enthusiasm to participate in the country's freedom struggle even made him extend support to the

extremists. Due to this, he came under police surveillance. But later he realised that ahimsa or non-violence was the only way to free India from the clutches of the British. So he took a pledge to serve the nation through Hindi writings. He also adorned khadi throughout his life after taking an oath to propagate non-violence. To support the freedom struggle in his own little way, he started a weekly, Swatantra. Many articles and poems published in the magazine were able to arouse nationalist sentiments against the British. This made the British administration to keep a close watch on his activities. But before the British could contemplate any action against him, he had moved to Jhansi. After Mahatma Gandhi launched the Quit India movement in 1942, he joined the campaign by publishing the daily, Jagran, to support and highlight the movement. Through the newspaper, he made a significant contribution towards the freedom struggle. With the dawn of India's independence, Puran Chandra Gupta went a step further to strengthen the growth of his media house with the publication of Dainik Jagran in Kanpur on September 21, 1947.


He had a staunch faith in Indian moral values and was always against conservatism which helped him frame and enrich the editorial policy of Dainik Jagran. His profound personality was reflected through his mannerisms and in the managing of tasks and people. Be it family members or employees, he used to lend a ear to all, irrespective of stature or age. He had firm faith in democracy and the freedom of speech. During the Emergency, he protested against the Government's autocracy by keeping the editorial pages blank. Only the words, "Naya loktantra...Censor laagoo... Kripya shaant rahein..." were printed in the editorial section. This protest led to his imprisonment along with

the incarceration of his two sons, Narendra Mohan and Mahendra Mohan. However, the jail term did not douse his patriotic passion that remained with him even in a free, democratic India.

He considered unity as a strength not only for a family but for the nation as well. He believed in the adage: 'United we stand and divided we fall', and ensured that his family and business reap the fruits of success in a united way. Whenever Puran Chandra Gupta found himself surrounded by perplexities and challenges, it was his wife Lakshmi Devi who acted as a pillar of strength. helping him overcome the odds. His married life clearly exemplified the saying, "Behind every successful man, there is a woman." In fact, it was she who gave the name of 'Jagran'. The immense love and trust between husband and wife was what helped them remain together despite Puran Chandra Gupta being engaged first in the freedom struggle and later in establishing his media empire.

Puran Chandra Gupta was aware of the progressive role of newspapers in a nascent democracy, and ensured that Dainik Jagran fulfilled this role. He was uncompromising when it came to the principles he stood for, and this put him famously on a collision course with the government during the Emergency. He welcomed imprisonment, rather than sacrificing the democratic values that he stood for. He was elected Chairman of the Audit Bureau of Circulation in 1974-75 and of PTI in 1975. He remained an executive member of the Indian Newspaper Society for 15 years and also served as its Deputy President, Puran Chandra's legacy was carried forward by literary stalwarts like Shri Narendra Mohan, After this Dainik Jagran ventured out into other states like Uttarakhand, Haryana, Bihar, Jharkhand, Punjab, Jammu, Himachal Pradesh and West Bengal.





Swami Ram Ji (1925-1996)

Puranchandra Vidyaniketan, popularly known as PCVN was established in the memory of pioneer of Hindi journalism, Late Sh. Puran Chandra Gupta ji under the inspiration of Late Shri Swami Ram to provide best possible education. His Holiness Swami Ram was distinguished Chief Guest at PCVN in the year 1993 along with then Governor of Uttar Pradesh Shri Motilal Vohra for Annual Day function. Late Swami Ram Ji was also the Spiritual Head of Shri Puran Chandra Gupta Smarak Trust.


Sri Swami Ram Ji was born in a small village called Toli in the Garhwal Himalayas. Swami Ram was one of the first yogis, to be studied by Western scientists. In the 1960s he was examined by scientists at the Menninger Clinic who studied his ability to voluntarily control bodily processes

(such as heartbeat, blood pressure, and body temperature) that are normally considered to be non-voluntary.

In his early life, he traveled to Tibet to study with his grandmaster. He received his higher education at Bangalore, Prayaga, Varanasi, and Oxford. At the young age of 24 years he became Shankaracharya of Karvirpitham in South India, succeeding Dr. Kurtkoti to the highest spiritual position in India. He renounced the dignity and prestige to this high office in 1952 to return to the Himalayas to intensify his meditative practices in the monasteries. After completing a very intense, 11-month meditation and pranayama practice in isolation, he emerged with the determination to serve humanity. Swami Ram began his task by studying Western philosophy and psychology, and teaching Eastern philosophy at many Western universities. He worked as a medical consultant in London and assisted in para-psychological research in Moscow. He then returned to India, where he established a clinic and ashram in Rishikesh. He completed his degree at the medical college in Darbhanga in 1960. Later he went to Japan, where he established a major spiritual center.

He was the founder of the Himalayan Institute of Yoga Science and Philosophy, which has its headquarters in Honesdale, Pennsylvania, and branches in the USA, Europe, and India. Swami Ram also founded other teaching and service organizations.. Swami Ram authored several books in which he describes the path he took to becoming a yogi and lays out the philosophy and benefits behind practices such as meditation. One of the common themes expressed in such books as Enlightenment Without God and Living with the Himalayan Masters is the ability of any person to achieve peace without the need for a structured religion.





Narendra Mohan Gupta (10 October 1934 -20 September 2002)

Shri Narendra Mohan Gupta was Chairman and Managing Director of the Jagran Prakashan, publishers of India's largest selling Hindi newspaper Dainik Jagran. Late Narendra Mohan was renowned for his dedicated journalism, simplicity and sincerity and was champion in steering the business to its unsurpassable position today - 37 editions, a massive 25 million readers, apart from making it one of the most influential newspapers in the country. During his heyday, Mr. Mohan was an extremely hands-on editor and wrote editorials, a column and one poem each week in Dainik Jagran. Born on 10th October 1934 Shri Narendra Mohan took the charge of Jagran Group in 1987 as the Chairman and Chief editor after the death of his father, Puran Chandra Gupta. He was known for his significant contribution to the media industry. He was one of the most vocal voices that persuaded the government to allow FDI in print media.

Narendra Mohan Gupta bagged several awards for his accomplishments like Dr Ram Manohar Lohia Award in 1986 for outstanding contribution to Journalism, Matushree Award in 1989 for outstanding contribution to Journalism, Sita Awards and Sanskriti Awards by Hindi Academy. Narendra Mohan authored thousands of articles on various topics, short stories in Hindi and his favourite poems. He also authored three anthologies of poems titled - Amrit ki Oar, Dasatva Se Ubharo and Thumara Sangeet. Narendra Mohan was also the author of four books, namely - Dharm Aur Sampradayikta, Aaj Ki Rajneeti Aur Bhrashtachar, Bharatiya Sanskriti and Hindutva.

Married to Shrimati Saroj Gupta, Narendra Mohan had a multi-faceted personality. His favourite leisure time activity was listening to devotional songs and reading books and literature. He also had keen interest in Defence, Finance, Culture and Foriegn Affairs. In recognition of his achievements, Narendra Mohan was nominated to the Rajya Sabha in 1996.







Puran Chandra Gupta Smarak Trust was formed in memory of Shri Puran Chandra Gupta Ji, as when alive he was always thinking of ways to impart education. Besides these, there are also Management, Law and Degree colleges etc to serve the community.

Over 7500 students today are studying in these institutions, with a large number of its pass outs holding several responsible positions in the country and abroad.

Shri Puranchandra Gupta Smarak Trust was established in the year 1987 to perpetuate the sacred memory of late Shri Puran Chandra Gupta, the Founder of Dainik Jagran, the largest read newspaper of the country across all languages. The trust was registered as an educational society for the purpose of developing and catering to educational, spiritual, cultural and health needs of the most deprived areas of Kanpur and for other philanthropic purposes. One of the main objectives for establishment of the society was to serve the society by establishing educational institutions to give benefit to the people irrespective of caste, creed, race or religion and without having any profit motive.

After its formation, the trust established one educational institution, Puranchandra Vidyaniketan at Kanpur in 1991 to provide best possible education, synthesizing the Indian culture, heritage and traditions with modern education technology; right from KG to Class 12 level.

Since its inception the society has followed all statutory requirements by having representation of academicians, Government representatives, parents as well as teachers as Members of Management Committee for productive deliberations and progress.

Under the aegis of the Trust, Puranchandra

Vidyaniketan was set up in Kanpur, Jagran Public School in NOIDA, Lucknow and Varanasi while franchisee JPS Schools are at Kannauj and Basti. With the passage of time, Puranchandra Vidyaniketan has come of age and has established its credentials as one of the best institutions not only in Kanpur but also in the whole of UP. The School envisions a robust, vibrant and holistic education that stimulates excellence in every endeavour of the students. Further the school is committed to provide quality education to promote intellectual, social and cultural vivacity among the learners.

The society and school's obligation to students goes beyond basic education, as the faculty helps them grow into conscientious, confident and independent individuals. In keeping with CBSE norms the school advocates continuous and comprehensive evaluation with an emphasis on holistic development of learners and commits itself to providing a stress-free learning environment to develop competent, confident and enterprising citizens who can promote harmony and peace.

At present Puranchandra Vidyaniketan is home to 2200 students right from Nursery to 12th Standard with all student specific academic, recreational, sports, cultural amenities and equipments at their disposal for their holistic growth.

Affiliated to CBSE to teach Humanities, Science and Commerce stream its standards and achievements can be compared with any public school in the country. The school primarily caters to those who reside in south Kanpur but many from north Kanpur also seek it.

To fulfill its main objective, the trust has decided to establish Jagran Public Schools in other parts of the country primarily in such centers from where Dainik Jagran Newspaper is published. All its schools have geared-up to take on the challenges of the future head-on. They perceive their role as custodian of our country's future and accordingly strive to encourage the children to excel not only at academics, but as responsible citizens of tomorrow with a sense of duty and responsibility towards our nation. This campus was established in the year 2005 in an imposing centrally air-conditioned building of Jagran Institute of Management. As part of technological upgradation, the Institute has launched video conferencing facility for classes.

JAGRAN COLLEGE OF ARTS, SCIENCE & COMMERCE, KANPUR:

The Trust has established Jagran College of Arts, Science and Commerce at Kanpur also in 2006 duly affiliated to CSJM University, Kanpur. The College of Arts, Science & Commerce will cater to the need of Northern India and provide various courses of Arts, Sciences & Commerce at the Graduate and Post Graduate levels. The college has also received the approval of BBA Course from Government.

Jagran School of Law was established in the year 2013 at Dehradun spreading in the area of 5 acres of land. The School provides BA LLB (5 years Integrated Programme), BBA, LLB (5 Years Integrated Programme), LLB (3 years Programme) and LLM (2 Years Programme) duly affiliated to Uttarakhand Technical University, Dehradun and Bar Council of India. This is the only Law School in Uttarakhand with infrastructure exactly as per Bar Council of India norms and aims at quality education in



the field of Law. It will nurture talent for empowering the students to compete in the field of Law. In addition to the excellence in Law Education, it also imbibes the holistic development of the personality of students to become world citizens in the real sense of the term.

Spread over a six acre plot in Barra locality of South Kanpur, Puranchandra Vidyaniketan aims to provide an academic environment which treats each child as a unique individual and develops them to their maximum potential. Also, the school aims to provide a variety of learning experiences which promote integrated growth in all areas, be it physical, intellectual, moral or social.

With excellence in educational qualities this new era school has all the state of the art facilities of 70 spacious classrooms, 12 large digital learning resource centres for each class along with science, geography, mathematics and language laboratories, audio visual rooms, four level specific staffrooms, sports facilities, various indoor and outdoor activities for

curricular, non-curricular and extra curricular areas of the children's learning.

The campus is well planned with plenty of greenery around with red brick-textured walls - offering the perfect setting for physical well-being and intellectual growth of the students. The playground and gardens all over the campus provide a pleasing sight and a suitable atmosphere. There is also a new block which consists of smart-classes and five state of the art computer laboratories.

The airy classrooms spread over four floors have staff rooms and wash areas located for easy reach. The Quadrangle or the Assembly area can easily accommodate 1800 students.







A spacious hall, six music halls with air-conditioning and various musical equipments, three art halls, two craft halls, two audio-visual room, High Definition Equipments to make learning an enjoyable experience, two libraries and two Learning Resource Centres (both for primary and middle groups), Science Laboratories for the senior classes, four computer labs equipped with latest equipments, four staff rooms, and administrative offices.


Surrounding the magnificent school structure, is one of the best playing fields for a school in the city of Kanpur. It has a 200 meters, six-lane athletics track, long jump and high jump pits. It also embeds a regular cricket practice pitch. It serves as a single full size football field or two adjacent, full size hockey fields during the

respective seasons. In winters, young cricketers of the school get to play inter school and Kanpur Cricket Association league matches. With its lush green outfield, it provides an absorbing view to the spectators on match days. Various School events and functions are also held here. On the far side of the school ground one can find the two cemented courts of Basketball.

The school basement, covering the entire Primary section of the school acts as a multipurpose hall for various activities, indoor events and sports. Indoor games like badminton, karate and bench press events have been held here. It also houses a modern Gymnasium equipped with latest fitness equipments. In addition a number of exhibitions of art, craft and various hands-on workshops are held there.

Over all, the full space of the school with built up area and the games fields with the green gardens have a well defined purpose for optimum balance of academic pursuit, activity base learning, experimentation and enjoyment of school time of the pupils. All infrastructure is geared to offer the best of opportunities for each child.

A team of 100 teachers, 10 administrative staff, 40 support services staff provide the human resources. The well qualified and experienced teachers who vigorously hone their skills with frequent in-service training all over India are caring enough to make every child a special one. All these infrastructure and resources are harnessed well for development and growth of students and staff as well as the School by Principals who are committed to lead for long.































































A TODDLERS' ABODE



At Puranchandra, the nursery curriculum provides the right array of activities to help children move towards achieving their early learning goals. In the Nursery Wing, children are encouraged to augment their learning through collaborative activities in the areas of dramatics, science and arts. The Nursery programme teaches prereading, pre-writing, pre-maths, science and social skills in a logical, natural sequence that encourages to learn slowly but strongly.


Through these activities, children learn the alphabet and letter sounds, numbers and simple maths and they master early writing skills. Art, music, drama, plays and social interactions help each nursery child explore creatively and build self-esteem. Each new accomplishment fills these three-year-olds the desire to learn more. They realize, "I can do it!" and our nursery readiness programme makes it easy and exciting for them to learn.

One of the most important benefits of going to Nursery classes is the social interaction and learning to be self-sufficient. The children are in safe environment - physically, emotionally and socially. Young children learn to live in a classroom community; they learn to follow a routine, and to get along with people who aren't their relatives. They learn social skills when interacting with other children. These social skills are critical to a developing personality.

The classrooms of the Nursery Wing have state of art learning facilities to ensure all round development of the toddlers. Each classroom has a different theme and they are decked up accordingly in different colours and cartoon characters on the walls. All Nursery rooms which provide ample playing space adjoin swings, garden areas with tree shade, sand pits, outdoor play equipment; just perfect for the little ones.




























































CULTURE HOLDS THE KEY


















SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITIES TO THE FORE


Other occasions celebrated include Teachers' Day, Children's Day, Class XII Farewell, PESA meet and the End of the term Assembly.



Activities have always been an integral part of the day in their life at PCVN for its students. They are seen as important for students. The sought after Adventure Sports include activities like Rope Climbing, Trekking, Hiking to exotic locales like Gangotri, Munsiyari, Chail etc, whose experience and memories are truly cherished. These activities are done under supervision of trained experts.

Then come a series of activities involving fabric and textile. Students make beautiful textile pieces by dyeing techniques of Batik. Best Out of Waste, is one where students use and give new life to waste items, turning them into something useful and beautiful. Block Printing cultivates love for colourful designs and prints while, Tie and Dye is a similar activity which teaches students to create beautiful designs with colours. Embroidery is important for the students as it has a large variety of stitches including chain stitch, button hole stitch, lazy daisy, kantha work, chikankari, back stitch, running stitch etc.

On a different note, comes Book Binding helping students learn creativity even in such old fashioned craft. Box Making is another craft that is not only artistic in itself as students learn about making different boxes to make them look presentable and attractive.





Calligraphy is an art which enhances the creativity by training the skill to make handwriting ornate and eye-catching. Creative activities like Ceramic Designing involve students in making beautiful articles with soft dough prepared by mixing specific ingredients. Yet another one is Card Making. One more foray into creativity is through Clay Modelling, a fun filled activity for students as they mold clay into beautiful shapes of various sizes while designing with their imagination. Envelope Making is an activity that students take up. Fountain Making activity enables students to think constructively, creatively and go beyond all imagination. With so many activities for students in the forefront still Gardening is not left behind. So here we have students learning various aspects of preparing soil, planting seeds and cuttings, watering, weeding, growing foliage and flowering plants and to arrange them in an aesthetically pleasing display.

To inculcate good social habits and customs the school teaches Gift Wrapping as an activity. Glass Painting just needs glass, a liner, colours and sense of colour scheme with artistic imagination from the students.

Jewellery Designing has always drawn the interest of girl students. In this activity they creatively design bangles and anklets. Exquisite little pieces

designed by them when displayed at exhibitions, draw the appreciation of parents and visitors alike. Absolute diverse streak finds expression in the Lampshade Making activity in which the students show their creativity and skills by using everyday materials to bring out spectacular lampshades.

The school provides a wonderful opportunity to learn and enjoy Nib-Painting too. In this a figure is covered with white outlining and is kept to dry. The painting is then filled with oil colours with a nib which is used to make bright strokes of colours. Similar colourful activity is of Paper Cut Flower making in which the flowers stay attractive for long. Origami is quite interesting for the students as it is an old paper folding Japanese art. With the help of this technique designs of living creatures etc. can be made.

Amongst others, in its activity of Non-Fire Cooking, the school teaches making sumptuous food without the use of fire. Apart from making dishes, students become acquainted with garnishing, decorating and presenting the table too. In all it brings in mouth-watering results.

Then comes the Wood Craft activity that needs lots of patience and concentration as one has to work with tools like chisel, nails, hammer, etc. For carpentry, there is a separate room in the school

which provides the tools and accessories.



Achievements

Puranchandra Vidyaniketan bears the distinction of excellence in every field from its inception. While the achievements at city and state level are too numerous to even list here, there are noteworthy feats at the National level. To name a select few, In 1992, Sumit Saneja and Anuj Tandon completed the Adventure Course at Nehru Institute of Mountaineering, Uttarkashi. The year next, our students contributed Rs. 15000/- to Maharashtra Earthquake Relief Fund. 1994 saw the school Football team at quarter finals of Subroto Cup, the School choir was Second in All India National Group Song Competition at FICCI Auditorium, New Delhi and, the Cricketers won the Singhania Cup at New Delhi. In 1995, Kusum Bhojwani was selected for the National Basketball Camp held at Calcutta and represented India at 13th ABC Junior Basketball Tournament while in the following year, Jagmeet Kaur was First in Shotput and School relay team was Runners-up in CBSE East Zone Athletics held at DPS Ghaziabad. They also won GOLD at CBSE National Athletics held at MLNSS, Rai. Jagmeet Kaur kept her streak to win GOLD in Shotput and Discuss Throw in CBSE National Athletics held at LNCPE, Gwalior. In 1997 Himanshu Pandey was selected for the Republic Day NCC Contingent. And the next year Girls basketball team was Runners-up at CBSE Cluster III Tournament, In 1998 School Hosted CBSE Cluster III Kho-Kho Tournament and Shikha Sharma won a Bronze at CBSE National Athletics held at Vijayawada. In 1999 Saikat Ray won All India Talent Scholarship for a 10 day trip to Europe, and in 2001, Amit Arora got All India SIXTH rank in National Cyber Olympiad with the year 2002 bringing another happy news as School won the Rolling Trophy at Vidya Devi Jindal All India Art Competition and the Boys team won Dhyan Chand Hockey Tournament.

A year passed and in 2004, Adit Pandita, Abhishek Shukla and Arpit Maheshwari represented UP at National Science Conference held at Tirupathi and in 2005, Prince Arora and Amit Arora won first Prize for software design at Techriti organized by IIT-Kanpur and PCVN team was Second in OP Jindal Memorial Art Competition held at Hisar. In 2007, our school's science model was adjudged the best top 20 models at CBSE National Science Exhibition. The same year, we won the All India Inter School Cricket Tournament at Assam Valley School and Nancy Shukla represented Cluster IV in 100 & 200 Flat races at CBSE National Athletics at Jamshedpur. In 2008, our students won First Prize in Art and Debate in VISION competition at Mussorie International School, Mussorie. The year 2009 brought further accolades, as our athletes won a Gold, 6 Silver and 3 Bronze medals at CBSE Cluster IV Athletics as Anwar Khan and Yajush Dhawan represented Cluster IV at CBSE National Athletics held at Mehsana, Gujarat.



In 2009, Our Principal, Mr. Bhaskar Ganti was conferred the National Award with the President of India Medal on the Teachers' Day. 2011 saw Ayushi Bajpai and Vishakha Gupta winning the CBSE regional debate to represent school at National Level, New Delhi and Shiuli Chatterjee and Shikhar Awasthi represented UP at Prof. Brahm Prakash Memorial Metals and Materials Quiz held at Kalpakkam. The feat was repeated in 2012, when Savneet Kaur and Kapil Sethi represented School and UP in the same National Quiz. It is a hat-trick in 2015 as Shaelja Mishra and Prakhar Seth echoed the achivement. Khyati Agarwal and Prakhar Shukla won the Young Scientist Award at All India Young Scientist Video Podcast Competition organized by SPACE and Vaibhav Awasthi won 2nd Prize in Indian Postal Department national level Letter Writing Competition and quite commendably, PCVN was presented a certificate by The Centre of Science and Environment, New Delhi for observing all environmental norms with zeal.

In 2013 Masoom Suchdeo won Third Prize in National Essay Competition by Korean Cultural Centre India and Digvijay Prasad and Aditya Dwivedi, won Bharat Ko Jano Quiz state level to participate in Nationals. 2014 saw Pramiti Tiwari winning the Gurutsav National Essay organized by Ministry of HRD while a film made by our students was one of the 20 best screened at National Youth Film Festival organized at Noida; Suyash Dixit won the First Prize in National Essay Competition organised by Korean Cultural Centre India and Somya Singh won Second Prize in 200 M Flat race CBSE Cluster IV athletics to qualify for the CBSE National Athletics held at Mehsana; Aditya Dwivedi's essay on Pt. Deen Dayal Upadhyay was selected in the Top Ten best essays of India in its category in Expression Series Competition organized by Ministry of HRD.

The 2015-16 session is yet midway but sparkle is already on. Ananya Mishra (XI-B) won INTACH Tiger Tales award and Ananya Mishra and Shreyansh Nigam won the Inspire Award Science Exhibition to qualify for Nationals to be held at Pragati Maidan, New Delhi. The School tied up with 'Shankar Mahadevan Academy' for activity-based music appreciation and learning. In July 2015 our class V were part of the SMA global music meet held at Bengaluru.

Shubham Mishra of Class XII was one among the 10 winners across India in the senior category of CBSE Aavishkar Series.

I am proud of seeing the pupils from varied backgrounds working so diligently adding value to their learning. Once, somebody asked..... What my target for the school is.


